Essays should be between 500-750 words. They must be written in English on 8 ½ by 11 inch paper. Typed essays are preferred. Please read the question carefully to ensure that your essay covers **both** parts of the theme.

Applicants must submit his or her most **recent** transcript (high school or college), a copy of a college acceptance letter, and proof of honorable military service, such as a copy of a DD-214, military ID card, etc.
